**Ken Levine (Writer)** With a career spanning over 30 years, Levine worked as the head writer of *MASH*, producer of *Cheers*, creative consultant of *Frasier* and *Wings*, wrote episodes for *The Simpsons*, *The Jeffersons*, and *Becker* amongst others, and cocreated three of his own series including *Almost Perfect* starring Nancy Travis. *A or B?* is Levine's second stage play--his first, *Upfronts and Personal* received several stage readings in Los Angeles and New York with cast members including Jason Alexander, and Ed Asner. Within the last 20 years Levine did radio/TV play-by-play for the Baltimore Orioles, Seattle Mariners, and San Diego Padres, contributed to ESPN and Fox Sports, as well as hosted Dodger Talk for eight years on the Los Angeles Dodgers Radio Network, of which he was twice named "Best Sports Talk Host" by the Southern California Sportscasters Association.
